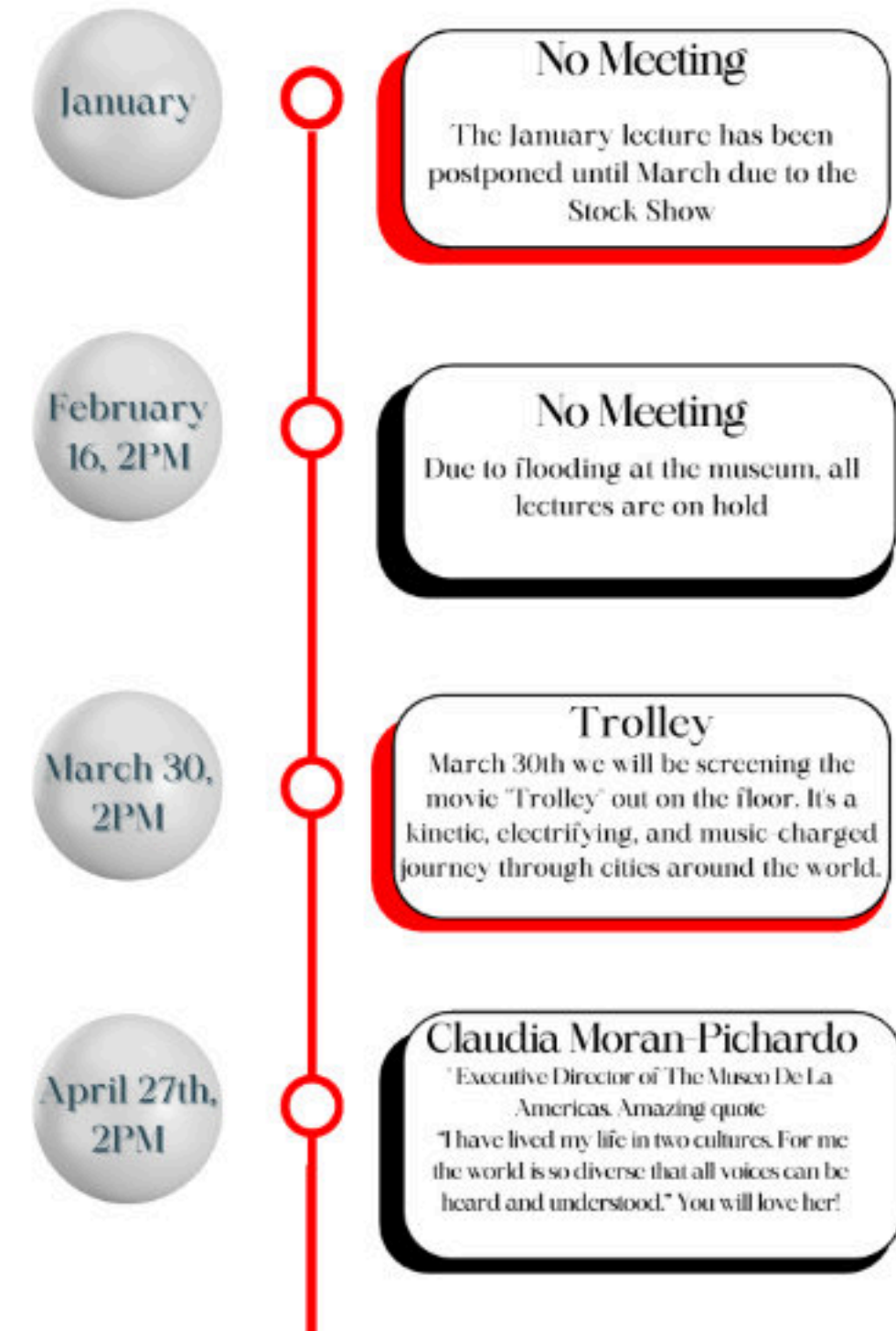
We will not be holding lectures in October due to our Halloween events.
